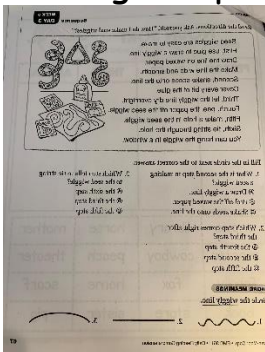

This change in water level is caused by the back and forth movement of the ocean tides.

Grand-Pre is a monument (a special statue) and memorial church that were built to honour the Acadians who were deported from Canada between 1755 and 1762. It is built on one of the first Acadian settlements and many Acadians visit here every year to remember their heritage and remember their ancestors. Every year in July a celebration called Acadian Days takes place to celebrate Acadian culture, food, music, art and religion.

Tartan is a type of plaid fabric that is unique to different regions in Scotland. Tartan is often worn as a kilt, or a traditional knee-length skirt. Tartan Day is celebrated every year across Canada. The first Tartan Day was April 6, 1987. It was created to promote the Scottish heritage of over 4.5 million Canadians. In 2000 Canada developed its own tartan. It is red, yellow, and green representing the colours of leaves in the fall.

The Bluenose is a Canadian symbol that you can find on the dime. It is a famous boat because it was designed as a fishing and racing boat. It was launched (the first voyage) in 1933 and then won many races around the world.

The Bluenose was nicknamed "The Queen of the Atlantic" it appeared at the Chicago World Fair in 1933 and the Silver Jubilee Ring George V's 25th Anniversary on flags in England in 1935. Today you can visit the Bluenose II (that which was built after the Bluenose crashed and sank).

**F Miqmaq Pow Wow**



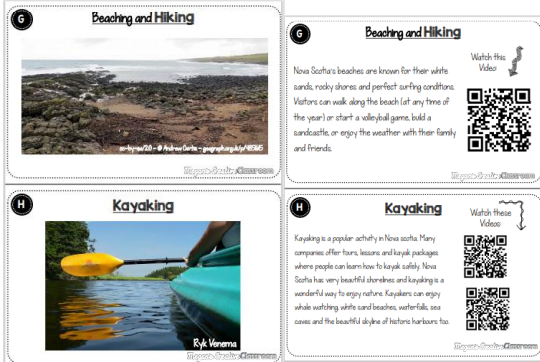

Pow Wows are a celebration of Aboriginal culture, tradition and history. They take place a few times a year and are organized by volunteers who want to share the Miqmaq culture with others. Everyone has an important part. Craft makers make thank you gifts for a giveaway. Gifts are given to children and Elders as a way of sharing and teaching their children to not be selfish. Craft makers may also set up tables to sell their work. Drummers and dancers will also perform and encourage people to participate. Pow Wows are a time for sharing, teaching and spending time together.
