We have Teams meetings today at 8:30, 10:30, and 1:00.

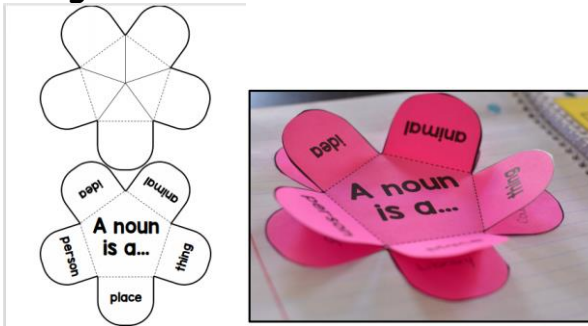

Quick Facts **Fishing in Nova Scotia**

There are many different boats used by fishermen in Nova Scotia. Each boat has special features that help fishermen catch fish, crustaceans, scallops, and even mussels and seaweed!

Some of the fish caught in Nova Scotia may sound familiar to you: haddock, halibut, herring, cod, tuna and swordfish are all popular catches.

Crustacean is a term meaning the animal has an exoskeleton which protects them from predators. Some examples of crustaceans are crabs, lobsters, shrimp and crayfish.

Fish, crustaceans and scallops caught in Nova Scotia are exported all over the world including grocery stores here in Alberta.

Fishing licenses are very expensive! They can cost even more than a house and fishermen often have to take out a loan to pay for them.

Fishing is not just for professionals! Many people enjoy fishing as a hobby. There are even classes for people of all ages to learn how to fish!

The lobster (the boat on the Canadian dime) was built in Nova Scotia. It was a racing and fishing boat and won many fishing challenge awards.

The black head is Nova Scotia's provincial fish. It is green, sometimes grey and has red spots with blue halos on the body.
